Message from the Head

We are picking up momentum and the days are certainly filled with exciting learning experiences at the moment. Children have been working with Mr Butcher to measure the school field and work out how many laps they would need to walk to have 'walked' to Aldeburgh, or Leiston or other surrounding towns and villages. Shortly this 'How far can you walk?' challenge will be up and running and classes will be competing with others in a friendly more

informal way to see how far they can walk over the next half term. The beauty of this is that the children are able to decide to do it themselves at breaks and lunchtimes, can log their own laps walked and are quickly able to determine how far they have travelled, whilst getting fitter in the bargain!

Stars of the Week

This week we have been focussing on DEMOCRACY. Children have considered how they can become more involved in decision making in a fair and democratic way and have considered what might happen in society if people were not able to make their voices heard in a fair and just way. We have been working hard to become more understanding of each other as a result. Our pupils of the week for being democratic are: Alice in Oak class; Louis in Hawthorn class; Jack in Rowan class; Digby in Chestnut class and Matilda in Silver Birch class. It has been good to listen to children discussing their understanding of what democracy means and how they might demonstrate it in their relationships with each other. The School Council

This week the school council have been consulting with their peers regarding the taught curriculum. They have been asking children about what they enjoy about their learning at school and what topics they would be interested in learning about. A great number of children wanted to learn about Spain and what it would be like to be a child growing up in Spain or to be Spanish. Next Saturday is European Day of Languages and so the children's interests ties in neatly with our plans to celebrate this in some way. Therefore we have decided to hold our own 'European Languages Day' with a focus on language, culture, food, traditions, music and flags – using Spanish as our language of choice this time. The School Site

We have had a couple of near misses where cars parked across the entrance to the staff carpark have narrowly missed knocking cyclists off their bikes. Please can I remind you that the entrance to the car park is for staff use only and needs to be kept clear at all times to avoid the risk of accidents. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring this.

A number of children are riding their bikes or penny boards/skateboards and scooters on the school playground at the start and end of the day. This is not allowed on the school site due to the risk of accident and the volume of people using the playground at these times of the day. Please help us to keep everybody safe by ensuring your children follow these rules. Thank you.

Helping Us to Help You

Already we have a number of items of lost property. When clothing and other items of school equipment is named it enables staff to get it back to its rightful owner very quickly. Please support us in our efforts by ensuring all property is clearly marked with your child's name. There are two coats in the lost property bin and other unnamed items.

It would help staff in the office greatly if all money coming in to school could be in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name and what the money is for. Cheques are preferred but cash in named envelopes will be accepted. We are unable to accept loose change any longer. Please ensure your child has PE kit that is suitable for outdoor PE in all weathers, especially as the weather gets colder. A warm sweatshirt and track suit bottoms are preferable and outdoor footwear. It would also be useful if your child had a named pair of wellington boots in school as we continue to allow children to use the play spaces and the field if their footwear is suitable. Wellies are changed before coming back in to the building so mud is not tracked back in to teaching spaces.

Safeguarding

If somebody else is collecting your child at the end of the school day staff are only able to release your child to them if we have prior knowledge of this. To keep all of our children safe we will only let them leave with a known adult, unless you have informed us of a different arrangement.
